- Copy of Rabies & Other Vaccinations
- Two-Week Supply of Pet Food & Water
- Appropriate-Sized Crate or Kennel
- Non-Spill Food & Water Bowl
- Medications & Prescriptions
- Poop Bags, Litter Box & Litter
- Disinfectant, Newspaper/Paper Towels
- Familiar Items: Toys, Treats, Blankets
- Recent Photo of Your Pet
- Microchip Information/Proof of Ownership
- Calming Medicine/Thunder Shirt
- Grooming Supplies
- Manual Can Opener (if needed)
- Flea, Tick & Heartworm Preventative
- Pet First Aid Kit & Book
- Leash, Harness & Collar with ID

Action Plan

Agree with family or roommates where to meet if you're not together when disaster strikes, and make sure everyone knows where emergency supplies are located. Should you need to evacuate identify hotels or motels outside of your immediate area that accept pets, or friends and relatives outside your immediate area if they would be willing to take in your pet.

Shelter

List of local pet-boarding facilities, lodgings or nearby friends or family who will allow you to stay with your pet or will take care of your pet.
